



## Week of June 5<sup>th</sup>-9<sup>th</sup>

### Farm & Forest Fun (entering K & 1<sup>st</sup> Grade)

Monday-Friday 9am-12 noon

Both the farm and the forest are filled with many different plants and animals. Some animals that live at Landmark Park come out at night to hunt for food, make repairs to their homes and frolic in the woods. Others are awake in the daytime grazing in the warmth and sunshine and sleep when the stars come out. Spend the week learning the difference between the nocturnal and diurnal animals that call the Park home. We will spend time on the farm with the animals active in the daytime and time in the forest looking for footprints, scat and other signs left behind by those animals only awake when the sun goes down.

Alabama is one of the most biologically diverse states in the nation. Unfortunately many of our plants and animals are either threatened or endangered and several are close to possible extinction. Once a plant or animal is extinct it is gone forever. Our Nature Detectives will spend the week exploring why certain plant and animal numbers are decreasing and what role we can play to stop more from disappearing forever.

This great week will be topped off with a cookout and sleep over in tents, as well as a little night exploring to get to know the nocturnal animals that call Landmark Park home. Thursday dinner and Friday breakfast will be provided.

### Earth Art (entering 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> grade)

### Secrets of the Vegetable Garden (entering K & 1<sup>st</sup> grade)

#### Animal Architects (entering K & 1<sup>st</sup> grade)

There are many different animals that call Landmark Park home. All of these animals have unique ways of building their homes and the architecture is different for each animal. The beaver uses trees from around the wetlands area, while the bird may gather materials from the farm. While exploring different areas of the Park, we will examine rotting logs, burrows, cavities, and different types of nests. We will make comparisons between the homes found at Landmark Park and our own homes, as well as how changes in weather can affect the animal homes.

#### Forest Mysteries (entering 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grade)

Learn about the forest and the things that live in the forest while hiking, examining rotting logs, and getting up close and personal with live animals. #### REGISTRATION INFORMATION

1. Registration begins at 9 a.m. Monday, March 20, 2017.
2. Registration is open to members only during the week of March 20-26. If all camps do not fill they will be offered to nonmembers on March 27.
3. Only active members at the family level or above are eligible for member's rates. Membership fees may be paid (or renewed) on the same day of registration. Please bring your membership card with you.
4. Registration will be taken in person, by mail, or online with credit card. The mail will NOT be opened until the day of registration.
5. The registration form and health form must be completed and signed by the child's parent.
6. Please complete one registration form for each child. Additional copies can be made of the form if needed.
7. All registrations must be accompanied by full payment at the time of registration.
8. All sessions are limited to 15 participants.
9. If a child is not of the proper age for the camp which he or she is registered for, registration will be considered void and the registration fee forfeited.
10. Cancellation Policy: To be eligible for a full refund, Landmark Park requires advance notice for all cancellations. If the participant's spot can be filled by another participant, you will receive a full refund minus our processing fee. All refunded registrations are charged an administrative processing fee of 10%. All programs canceled by Landmark Park will receive a full refund. Cancellations made within 72-hours prior to the program and no-shows are not eligible for a refund. If you are not eligible for a refund, a tax receipt will be issued to you indicating that the program fee was converted to a charitable donation.
11. If cancellations are made the day camp begins there will be NO REFUND.
12. Please give a second choice in case a camp has filled.
13. Grandparents can register grandchildren only if the grandparent has a FAMILY level membership or above.
