Watermelon Harvest and Sampling



Celebrate National Watermelon Month with Landmark Park during our Watermelon Harvest and Sampling on July 1 at 10 a.m. The Watermleon Sampling is free with paid gate admission. Special thanks to Master Gardener and park volunteer Tom Boyle for coordinating this event each year. Watermelon is a favorite summertime fruit throughout the South. This juicy fruit can be red, yellow, pink, or dark pink on the inside and be seeded or seedless. Watermelon is a flowering ground vine from the gourd family.

Over 1,000 varieties of watermelon are grown worldwide. Producing the biggest fruit on the longest vines, the watermelon also has the longest history of any of the melons. The first recorded evidence of a watermelon crop occurred over 5,000 years ago in Egypt. Depicted in hieroglyphics, watermelons were placed in the tombs of the pharaohs. It was used as a source of water for thirsty traders and even became a source of funds as traders began to sell watermelon seeds in cities along the ancient Mediterranean trade routes. Watermelons were even used during the Civil War for the Confederate Army, they boiled them down to create a source of sugar and molasses.

A single watermelon is made up of 92% water and is packed with healthy nutrients. They are a good source of antioxidants like vitamin A, vitamin C, vitamin B6, and potassium, magnesium, and dietary fiber. Visit www. alwatermelon.org for more info on watermelons.

Eclipse!

Get your calendars ready, a rare celestial event is happening this summer! A solar eclipse, where the moon will completely block out the sun giving momentary darkness during the day, will take place on August 21. This eclipse is special because this will be the first total eclipse to be seen only from the continental US in history since the birth of the nation in 1776. A total solar eclipse has not been seen in the nation since 1979, but this eclipse is special because this will be the first to be viewed from only the continental US in history. The eclipse will begin on the west coast in Madras, Oregon and travel diagonally across the country to Columbia, South Carolina.

It is dangerous to look directly at the sun and to view any part of the solar eclipse except the totality phase requires protective eye gear. NASA recommends eclipse gazers use special solar filters or "eclipse glasses" for safety. You can also make your own pinhole camera using two pieces of paper or cardboard. The pinhole camera allows viewers to see a projected image of the sun without directly looking at it. This will give sky gazers an idea of when totality nears and it is safe to view without protection.

Here in the Wiregrass we will get to see a partial eclipse, but many cities in the path of totality are holding eclipse celebrations that can be attended with just a short drive. However you decide to see the eclipse, it will definitely be a memorable experience. 

JULY 30: PEN STROKES OF JUSTICE: JUDGE HORTON AND THE SCOTTSBORO BOYS



Rebekah Davis joins us through the auspices of the Alabama Humanities Foundation's "Road Scholar" program. The history of the Scottsboro Boys—nine black

youths accused of raping two white women on a train in the Tennessee Valley of Alabama in the early 1930s—is well known. Little known, however, is the history of the Decatur judge who overturned the jury's guilty verdict levied against Haywood Patterson, the first defendant. Judge Horton received over 700 letters during the trial. He kept them all in two lard buckets. Davis will have audience members read from the letters during her discussion of the infamous case. Rebekah Davis is the archivist for Limestone County, Judge Horton's home, and serves as the president of the National Association of Government Archives and Records Administrators.




