# Landmark Park Reopens After Two Month Closure

Due to COVID-19 related concerns, Governor Kay Ivey issued a "Shelter in Place" order in March that required several businesses--including museums--to close until the threat of the virus waned. Since Landmark Park serves as Alabama's Official Museum of Agriculture, we followed the order and closed down for two months in order to help keep our community safe and healthy.

Even through the park was closed, the staff and volunteers never stopped working. Safely distanced, masked, and sanitized, we continued to care for the farm animals, cut grass, tend to gardens, plan for the future and learn new skills. Personally, I had a chance to work with Bill Miller and the Wiregrass Beekeepers to gain a better understanding of how a honeybee hive works. Membership Manager Julie Powell was inspired to try her hand at playing the mandolin so she could join in the Pickin in the Park jam sessions. The staff came together to clean up unused portions of park property to allow for future growth. Southeast Health requested that some of our volunteers who know how to sew make cloth masks for patients in the hospital and I'm proud to report that many masks plus some material was donated to help. We created virtual content to help enhance your at-home lessons for kids. The Wiregrass Master Gardeners Association continued to grow fresh vegetables in the Kitchen Garden to donate to the Wiregrass United Way Area Food Bank.

Many of our regular events have been canceled or postponed due to the spread of this virus. As we move forward, we ask that you please be patient with us as we navigate unchartered territory. We very much appreciate your support of Landmark Park. Your memberships, donations and volunteer work allow us to fulfill our mission even during difficult times.

### Animal Adventures

Every Thursday and Friday in July, Landmark Park will present Animal Adventures, a special one-hour educational program which provides a unique opportunity to learn about our natural world. Families and kids are invited to see first-hand the wonder of native and exotic animals. Programs begin at 10 a.m. in the Park's Interpretive Center Auditorium. ### **JULY 2: BIRDS OF PREY**

Join Jatin Patel and meet his birds of prey. Learn what these beautiful birds eat and what role they play in our environment.

### **JULY 3: AMPHIBIANS**

Amphibians can be slimy and lay eggs, but they also have a lot of other interesting characteristics. Join Jimmy Stiles as he talks about various amphibians including frogs, salamanders, and one big amphiuma. Stiles has been involved in herpetology for over 25 years and is currently working on his PhD in Wildlife Sciences through Auburn University. *This session will take place outdoors in the Amphitheater.* 

### JULY 9: LIFE OF A HONEYBEE

Wiregrass Beekeeper Rosalyn Horton will teach us all about the life of a honeybee. Learn the "waggle dance," taste a honey stick and hear why these animals are so important to us.

### **JULY 10: TORTOISES**

Big Bend Wildlife Refuge will teach us all about the wonderful world of tortoises. Feeding and nesting habits will be discussed, as well as what you should do if you find an orphaned or injured wildlife.

### **JULY 16: CHICKENS**

What came first, the chicken or the egg? While we may not crack that riddle, you will have a chance to learn all about chickens and see some of these beautiful animals up closes.

### **JULY 17: DOG TRAINING BASICS**

Our four legged furry friends will be the star of this program as local canine specialist Renee Jones-Lewis, along with her canine teaching assistant, show visitors the correct way to interact with dogs. Park visitors will learn training tips they can easily use with their own family pets.

Ken Weathers, of the Alabama Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries Department will present a program about common fish. Not only will you get to see the fish that are naturally found in our local lakes and rivers, you will also be able to brush up on your fishing and casting techniques.


### TRIBUTE FUND To Honor or Remember Family, Friends and Loved Ones
