

In our last issue of the Lark, we mentioned that we recently replaced the Waddell House fence. Perhaps you have been to the Park recently, seen this new fence, and wondered "Why does that fence look like that?" The design of the new fence is actually taken from a photograph of the Waddell House in its original location. When we decided to replace the fence, we started going through old photographs of the Waddell House taken prior to its move to the Park. It was in these photographs that we found the design that can be seen around the Waddell House now. This fence design has one common feature in southern fences: a "snake board" across the bottom to keep snakes out of the yard.
