Presented by the Alabama Humanities Foundation, this exhibit displays over 200 years of Alabama's history and looks toward the future. This traveling exhibit is making its way around the state, making a stop in each county.

This impressive display blends art, music, spoken word and interactive computer tablets to tell the story of Alabama, all the way from becoming a territory to achieving statehood. It also conveys a message of hope for the future. Landmark Park, like the other host communities, will include some historical exhibits and collateral programming and activities to showcase the history of Houston county.

To ensure everyone has a chance to view the exhibit, Landmark Park will offer free admission from **December 9-30** to the public. This is a great time to explore the exhibit and learn about our state and local history, as well as enjoy the park's boardwalk, nature trail, Wiregrass Farmstead and Barnyard playground.

Folk Arts Workshop Weekend

Join Landmark Park **February 16-17** for our annual Folk Arts Weekend Workshop! The Folk Arts Weekend is dedicated to introducing participants to a variety of folk crafts and skills. Classes will be offered during one of our three sessions; Saturday will have a morning and an afternoon session and Sunday will have afternoon session. Participants will be able to choose a different topic of interest for each session. Each session will last up to three hours and a hands-on element will be included. Session topics will range in variety and will include topics such as cooking on the hearth, beginning dulcimer playing, chair caning, tatting, and more, with a final schedule posted on our website by the first of January. Session prices vary depending on supplies needed and will range \$20-\$30 per session. Participants will be able to sign up for individual sessions, and there will be an option to include lunch. Bird Workshops

Landmark Park will offer three bird workshops this winter. Learn about these fascinating and lovely creatures of flight found in our local forests as well as your own backyard. All workshops begin at 10 a.m., are free with gate admission, and will be presented in the Interpretive Center Auditorium. To register, please go to www.landmarkparkdothan.com. Registration is required.

Dr. Gary Manfready will be back to conduct the Bluebird workshop on Saturday, **January 12**. Featuring new and updated information based on findings regarding bluebird populations in recent years. Dr. Manfready is a member of the North American Bluebird Society and has contributed articles for publication in their quarterly journal. He currently maintains four bluebird trails in Houston and Dale County including the one at Landmark Park and has a total of 75 boxes. His main focus is on population numbers and successful fledgling numbers in diverse environmental habitats.

On **January 19**, Fred Bassett will return to present the popular program on Hummingbirds. Bassett is a licensed bird bander specializing in the banding of hummingbirds and is the presiding of Hummingbird Research. This is a nonprofit organization dedicated to the study and preservation of hummingbirds and neo-tropical migrants. Fred Bassett is known throughout the Southeast for his work with the "jewels of the air." He will share his extensive knowledge of this little bird along with facts about nesting habits, food and caring for the feeders, as well as its migration pattern.

Dr. Gary Manfready will return on Saturday, **January 26** for a workshop on Purple Martins. Manfready will discuss migratory bird populations and the natural history of the species, plus housing requirements for Purple Martins and conservation efforts.

Quilt Retreat

Landmark Park's annual Quilt Retreat, led by Sherry Burkhalter, will be held on **February 8 from 5 p.m.-9 p.m. and February 9 from 9 a.m.-5 p.m.** in the Ag Building at the park. New Partnership with the Dothan Library



Starting in January 2019, Landmark Park is excited to partner with the Dothan Houston County Library System to provide an opportunity for community members to visit Landmark Park at no charge. Similar to a library book, a family pass to Landmark Park can be checked out with your library card. This pass is good for four people and for regular daily admission only (not special events). Families can check the pass out (good for one month) and turn it in at the Landmark Park gate to receive free admission. Only 10 passes will be in circulation each month. At the end of 2019, the names of the families who checked out a pass throughout the year will be entered into a drawing for a yearly Family Membership to Landmark Park. This can be used for either a new membership or for a renewal.

This program is similar to a program offered through the New York Public Library and will allow families to experience what Landmark Park has to offer before committing to a membership. We are happy to be included in this program and appreciate the work of Terah Shelton Harris and the staff at the Dothan Houston County Library System to get this program started. Landmark Park is happy to recognize Jean Beeker, one of our dedicated "Quilt Ladies," as our Volunteer of the Quarter. Jean grew up in Florida and moved to Dothan when she married Bob Beeker in 2000. She met Landmark Park Quilt Show chair Sherry Burkhalter at a sewing class and Jean got involved in with the park's quilt show, soliciting donations. She got her first donation from Red Elephant and since then, she averages about \$2000 of in-kind and monetary donations for each show. The show just celebrated its 10th year--that adds up to around \$20,000 of in-kind and monetary donations over the course of 10 years!

Jean and Bob volunteered together at the park in a variety of ways until he passed away in 2016. He also helped with the Quilt Show and also helped shear sheep. In the past, Jean has volunteered with the Living History educational program, Spring Farm Day, office work, Martin Drugstore and other park activities. Jean continues to help with the Quilt Show each year. She has been quilting for most of her adult life. She learned to quilt from her mother, a skill passed down to all the kids in her family. Jean has one daughter who lives in Virginia and three grandchildren--she's currently making a quilt to commemorate her oldest grandson's engagement.

Join Landmark Park for an evening of stargazing on February 1 from 6 p.m. – 9 p.m. Astronomy Night is an exciting and informative program that gives visitors a view of several stars and planets as well as the Orion nebula through telescopes and binoculars on the gazebo lawn. Staff members will help point out winter constellations and visitors will even get the chance to experience a starry hayride and campfire. Nightwalks will take place on the boardwalk. Warm up in the Interpretive Center after stargazing and enjoy snacks, a movie about Planets, and a program in the planetarium. Planetarium programs are not recommended for children under 5. Scouts are welcome, and Astronomy Night meets several requirements for the Astronomy Badge.

Admission is \$5 members, \$6 for scouts and their leaders in uniform and \$8 for nonmembers and free for children 5 and under.

Scott 1817 Seminole War Battle

The annual Scott 1817 Seminole War Battle & Living History Event will be held at Landmark Park on **December 1-2 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. each day**. This year's event has been relocated to Landmark Park from River Landing Park in Chattahoochee, Florida, due to damage from Hurricane Michael. It will return to Chattahoochee next year. The annual reenactment commemorates the Scott Battle of 1817 which was fought at present-day Chattahoochee on November 30, 1817. Angered over attacks by U.S. soldiers on the Muscogee (Creek) village of Fowltown, a large force of Red Stick Creek, Seminole and Black Seminole warriors attacked a keelboat moving up the Apalachicola River to Fort Scott on present-day Lake Seminole. The battle was the first U.S. defeat of the Seminole Wars and led to the transfer of Florida from Spain to the United States. Planned activities include daily battle reenactments, authentic Native American and frontier encampments, living history demonstrations, lectures on Creek War and Seminole War actions in the Wiregrass and more! Visitors of all ages are invited to see history come to life! Admission is \$4 for adults (ages 13 and up) and \$3 for children (ages 3-12). Chattahoochee residents with a photo ID showing their address will be admitted free. Park members and children 2 and under will also receive free admission. Donations will be accepted to help Chattahoochee Main Street recover from Hurricane Michael.
