Ellie and Jolie Byrd, then 7 and 5 respectively, started piano lessons. The rest - as we say at Landmark Park - is history. Later, Jolie changed to violin with Ellie adding violin too. After they were introduced to bluegrass, they knew it was a part of them. Soon Jolie wanted to learn guitar and Ellie thought the mandolin seemed fun. The younger girls, Annie and Lucie, received fiddles for Christmas. A couple of years later, Lucie added the mandolin and Annie soon learned her heart was with the banjo. Jimmy Riley, a frequent Landmark Park musician, agreed to teach all the girls at the same time. He told them they just needed a bass player. "We wanted Daddy to learn it, but he doesn't even have rhythm!" Mama Holly gave it a try, and two weeks later, played with the girls at a church event. Rhythmless Jamie runs sound and loads and unloads the trailer and looks after the little kids during Byrd Family concerts. The little kids (Titus, Asher, and Libie) are finding their spots among the instruments (dobro, cajon, fiddle). Everybody sings. Homeschooling helped find time for practicing. The oldest two have graduated and help the youngest two with their schoolwork.

Recently, they spent several days chinking the cabin in the Alabama Agricultural Museum's new exhibit. They learned something new by learning something old, which is what they've devoted their lives to so far with their music.

The family plays regularly at Pickin' in the Park, the second Saturday of each month. They entertained park visitors at Music by Moonlight and Fall Farm Day in 2020.
