
Quilting Class

Veteran's Garden

Most of the volunteers who work the raised beds in the Veteran's Garden at Landmark Park are indeed veterans. But not all. Some folks like to offer their services to service members.

Teresa Do was scrolling Facebook, when she saw a post about the Veteran's Garden. She is not a veteran, but she wanted to commit to a community garden. So, she dug in. "I love it so much that it became a place for me." She helps, as all volunteers do, as a way to connect with nature and other people. They've built their own community in the back field. Men and women of different backgrounds and ages learn from each other. Sometimes, grandkids assist. Occasionally, Scouts show up.

Every other Tuesday, a speaker, organized through Alabama Cooperative Extension, leads a workshop (for example, disease mitigation and pest control), then directs application (how to lookout for those problems). All other days, volunteers are welcome, at their convenience, during park hours. While they grow Wiregrassnative plants, they enjoy learning about varieties not typically found in our local grocery stores, like Black Sea Man tomato from Russia, tropical Malabar spinach, and Luffa gourd, that is often used as a vegetable in Asian countries.

The volunteers reap the reward of their labor, and take the food they need. Next, they give to friends and family. "Veterans know veterans." Whatever is left goes to the Wiregrass Area Food Bank. They are currently seeking a veteran's group to donate to, as well.

Their goal is to recover all existing 37 beds, and each season, plant more and more, for a "big ole harvest!"

The newfound friends come from all over the Wiregrass; some drive an hour or more. It's worth the effort to come to Landmark Park.


Welcome New Staff

Hammond-Young Drugstore which had previously been the Ed Nix Drugstore until November 1904 when Jim Young and Dr. George Hammond took over the business. In 1906-1907, the Hammond-Young Drugstore was torn down and the First National Bank was built on that corner. In 1982, the name of the bank was changed to Southtrust First National Bank of Dothan.

Artifact Exploration



Crepe Iron. Similar to a waffle iron, a crepe iron could be used to make crepes. Patented on June 29, 1880, this iron could have been used atop a wood stove or over a hearth. This crepe iron came from the home of the late T. Z. Atkinson, north of Columbia, Alabama.
