Astronomy Night



Join Landmark Park for an evening of stargazing on February 17 from 6 p.m. - 9 p.m. Astronomy Night is an exciting and informative program that gives visitors a view of several stars and planets through telescopes and binoculars on the gazebo lawn. Staff members will help point out winter constellations and visitors will get the chance to experience a starry hayride and campfire. Nightwalks will take place on the boardwalk. Warm up in the Interpretive Center after stargazing and enjoy out of this world snacks, space crafts, and a presentation on Astronomy Science in our Auditorium! Seed Swap and Garden Expo



On Saturday, January 28 from 10 a.m.-2 p.m., Landmark Park and the Wiregrass Master Gardener Association will present the annual Seed Swap and Garden Expo at the Stokes Activity Barn at Landmark Park.

Activites will include trading seeds with fellow gardeners, plus info and demos on beekeeping, backyard chickens, getting started with your home gardens, rain barrels, food preservation, composting and more. Bring your seeds to trade if you would like to participate in the Seed Swap.

This event is free with your paid gate admission (\$5 for adults, \$4 for kids, free for park members and children 2 and under). Hosted by Landmark Park, Wiregrass Master Gardeners Association, Alabama Cooperative Extension System and Wiregrass RC&D.

Beginning Beekeeping Course

Join the Wiregrass Beekeepers for the 2023 Spring Beginning Beekeeping Course. This course is designed to supply a novice beekeeper with all the information you need to take bee colonies from their inception through their first year. Attending the auditorium sessions is free, but for \$35, you will get a beekeeping book, all the class handouts, and a year's membership in the Wiregrass Beekeepers Association.

The four auditorium sessions will be held at the Landmark Park Interpretive Center at 10 a.m. and run for about 2 hours. The field session will start at 10 a.m. at Landmark Park Teaching Apiary. FEBRUARY 25 (AUDITORIUM): WELCOME TO BEEKEEPING AND EQUIPMENT OVERVIEW

We'll discuss beekeeping costs, time and products. We will also go over equipment needs, sources, and have hands-on equipment assembly. Bring a hammer!

MARCH 4 (AUDITORIUM): THE BEES AND THE COLONY

The bees in a colony come in three basic types – worker, drone, and queen. We'll discuss each type's unique biology, life cycle, and functions. We'll also discuss how the three types of bees form a working colony, and how it develops in its first year. We'll look at some of the things you will see as you examine your colonies.

MARCH 11 (AUDITORIUM): LAWS, PESTS, AND DISEASES

We'll cover Alabama registration requirements and common bee pests and diseases.

MARCH 18 (AUDITORIUM): THE BEEKEEPER'S YEAR AND WORKING A COLONY

We'll discuss the beekeeper's year, what is done when, and demonstrate working a colony (auditorium session with no bees).

MARCH 25 (TEACHING APIARY): LIVE COLONY FIELD SESSION

We will be working with live colonies, so beekeeping protective gear (at least a veil) will be required for all participants. We will meet at Landmark Park outside the Farm Museum then go over to the apiary. We'll put on protective gear, light smokers, and inspect the hives, emphasizing proper hive working procedure. We'll evaluate the colonies, find the three types of bees, and probably find a few unwelcome pests. We may even find and catch a swarm. (Weather permitting. Beekeeping protective gear required!)



The Stokes Activity Barn at Landmark Park is the perfect location for your big day. In the past it has been used for weddings, reunions, corporate events, proms and more. This 8,000 square foot facility can accommodate groups both large and small. Historic artifacts adorn the walls for a truly unique atmosphere and venue. The heated and air conditioned structure includes bathrooms, a caterer's kitchen with commercial freezer, double refrigerator, ice machine and oven. Also included with your rental are up to 42 (60") round tables, 10 (8') rectangle tables, 350 chairs and a sound system for background music and announcements. We even offer DISH TV so you can enjoy the big game with your friends. A bridal changing suite was added to the barn last year to give the ladies a luxurious place to get ready for their big day.

The Victorian-style Gazebo is also used for outdoor weddings and other events. The 1908 Headland Presbyterian Church, a restored 35'x35' building, seats about 60 people on 10 8-foot wooden benches. While the church is not heated or cooled, it does have ceiling fans and windows that can be opened. Both are just a short walk away from the Stokes Activity Barn. In addition to weddings, these venues have been used in the past for concerts and church services.

The Playground Pavilion is a covered 30'x42' picnic pavilion with 12 large picnic tables, adjacent to The Barnyard Playground at Landmark Park. Birthday parties, graduation parties, family reunions, church picnics and much more have taken place at this convenient location. Adults can gather in the shade while kids enjoy the playground.

In the Interpretive Center, the Auditorium can also be used for a variety of special events. Tables and chairs are included in the price of your rental. The Auditorium can seat around 45 people at tables and has been used for baby showers, birthday parties, corporate seminars and retreats.

Funds from rentals at Landmark Park help preserve the park for future generations.
